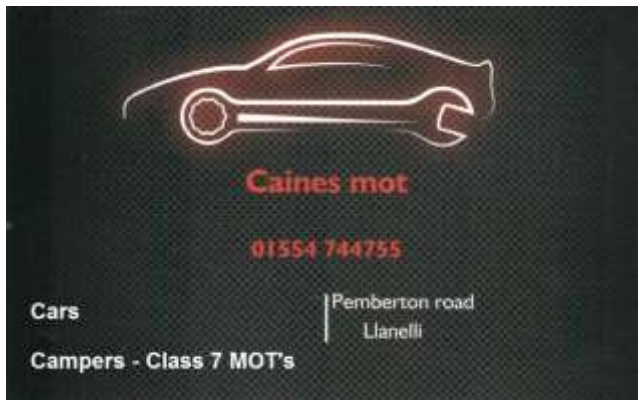

LOCAL RULES

Other local rules may appear on the Club Notice Boards. Members are strongly advised to carry a copy of the Rules of Golf when they play. Please familiarise yourselves thoroughly with the 'Etiquette' guidelines in Section 1 of the Rules of Golf.

GENERAL

A. RIGHTS OF WAY

Please be aware of the rights of way across the course. It is the people using these rights of way, not golfers, who have priority.

B. PRACTICE AREA TO THE RIGHT OF THE 15th HOLE

No practice shots are to be played over the public footpath from this practice area.

LOCAL RULES

1. OUT OF BOUNDS

- a) Beyond the boundaries of the course defined by fences or white posts.
- b) 18th hole/1st Tee and Clubhouse enclosure as defined by white posts.
- c) On the 1st hole, the out of bounds is on the right and behind the green only.

2. IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS

- a) Relief from interference by an immovable obstruction may be taken under Rule 24-2, except that
- b) The tramway from the 9th to the 14th hole is an integral part of the course.
- c) In addition, if a ball lies through the green and an immovable obstruction on or within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief as follows:

The ball must be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay which (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids intervention and (c) is not in a hazard or on a putting green. The ball may be cleaned when lifted.

3. STONES IN BUNKERS

- a) Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies).

4. GROUND UNDER REPAIR

- a) If there is interference by Ground Under Repair relief is compulsory (Rule 25-1 applies).

5. WINTER TEE MATS

- a) Where present, winter tee mats comprise the teeing ground. When starting a hole from a winter tee the player must play a ball from the mat. (Rule 11-4 applies).

6. DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES

- a) A player may obtain distance information by use of a distance-measuring device. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g. elevation changes, wind speed, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 14-3.

7. ACCIDENTAL MOVEMENT OF A BALL ON A PUTTING GREEN

- a) Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1 are modified as follows:
When a player's ball lies on the putting green, there is no penalty if the ball or ball-marker is accidentally moved by the player, his partner, his opponent, or any of their caddies or equipment.

The moved ball or ball-marker must be replaced as provided in Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1.

This Local Rule applies only when the player's ball or ball-marker lies on the putting green and any movement is accidental.

Note: If it is determined that a player's ball on the putting green was moved as a result of wind, water or some other natural cause such as the effects of gravity, the ball must be played as it lies from its new location. A ball-marker moved in such circumstances is replaced."

8. EMBEDDED BALL

Through the green, a ball that is embedded may be lifted, cleaned and dropped, without penalty, as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course through the green.

Exceptions:

- A player may not take relief under this Local Rule if the ball is embedded in sand in an area that is not closely-mown.
- A player may not take relief under this Local Rule if interference by anything other than the condition covered by this Local Rule makes the stroke clearly impracticable.

COMPETITION HANDBOOK 2018

Introduction

The Rules of Golf define the Committee as “the Committee in charge of the competition” and rule 33-1 states that “the committee must establish the conditions under which a competition is to be played”. This handbook is therefore designed to help both experienced and new golfers enjoy competitions in the full and certain knowledge of how competitions will be administered at Ashburnham Golf Club.

All references to “the Committee” mean the Council, with ultimate recourse to the Board of Directors if required in exceptional circumstances. In all cases the Rules of Golf take precedence over this Handbook.

The Handbook relates to Club competitions as arranged and managed by the Committee but holds no relevance to informal ‘roll-ups’ and the like operated by groups or individuals.

1. **Entry, eligibility and competition handicaps**

The conditions for entry and eligibility relate mainly to “Club” and “Men’s” competitions. For conditions of entry to Ladies’ competitions guidance should be sought from the Ladies’ Competition Secretary.

The Committee will determine the eligibility of who may participate in the competition, i.e. men, women, juniors, seniors etc. The competition may also have handicap restrictions which will be clearly displayed on the entry sheet.

Members must have a designated “competition” (c) handicap to be eligible to enter Club Match Play competitions. Players who have not submitted three Qualifying Scores (including NR’s, away, 9-hole qualifying competition and supplementary scores) during the preceding year will cease to have a designated “competition” (c) handicap next to their Handicap as from January 1st 2018. Players who have submitted 3 or more qualifying scores

will have a competition (c) handicap. Further guidance for new members, away and injured players is available from the Club Manager.

A player with a non-competition handicap wishing to revert to a competition handicap will be required to submit 3 new qualifying scores. "Topping up" is not permitted (i.e. a player returning 2 Qualifying scores in the calendar year will not have the designation removed by submitting 1 new score in the following year).

A competition handicap is required to qualify for winning/prizes in handicap qualifying competitions. Players with a non-competition handicap will be eligible to enter handicap qualifying competitions but will be unable to win any prizes. Scores from players with a non-competition handicap will not be included in the CSS calculation. A CONGU® Handicap designated as a competition handicap will be suffixed by the letter c: Example: 14c.

Entry is normally through the online BRS system for competitions or for specific competitions by adding your name to a start sheet or list which is displayed on the main notice board. Entry sheets are normally available at least two weeks prior to the actual competition, with pre allocated time slots depending upon the type of competition. The Committee also ask that names are not entered to hold spaces without the prior permission of those entered. The Committee reserves the right to disallow entry to future competitions if it feels that the system is being abused in any way.

For some events a 'closing date' may be applied after which any player removing their name or failing to attend will be held responsible for payment of the full entry fees. This will not necessarily prevent late entries to whom the same condition would apply. The application of a closing date will be indicated on the start sheet for the event. Any member required to pay fees in such circumstances will be notified of such by the Committee and will be excluded from entry to any competition until such payment is made.

Entry fees are to be paid to the Club Professional prior to playing. If for some reason this is not possible then the competitor should pay immediately on completion of the round after indicating to the Professional before play that they will be playing and will have been deemed to have

entered all parts of the competition, such as twos, unless prior arrangement has been made with the Club Professional.

Junior boy members are eligible to enter men's competitions, playing from the men's tees providing that they play with an adult member of the Club and hold a handicap of 15 or less.

2. Format

Matchplay

This format can either be singles, foursomes or four-ball matchplay and can be either on a scratch or handicap basis. If the format is on a handicap basis it will clearly be displayed what stroke allowance should be given. Dates for completion of such matches will be clearly displayed and in the event that the match is not played by that date then both competitors will be disqualified from the competition. It is the responsibility of all players to arrange a suitable time and date for the match to be played. The Committee will arbitrate in exceptional circumstances but only where all players have tried and been unsuccessful in agreeing a tie and date. Disqualification for all players is still an option under arbitration.

Stroke Play

This format can either be singles, foursomes or four-ball stroke play. In addition it can be on the basis of stableford or bogey/par.

Different handicap classes may be established and the Committee will determine classes in advance of entry. These classes for most stroke play competitions will be on the following basis:

Other formats

The Committee may decide to use a form of play not recognised by the Rules of Golf such as greensomes or scramble. The Committee will establish rules and conditions which will be specific to those events and such conditions will be displayed on the entry sheet.

3. Decision of ties

In the case of matchplay competitions ties will be decided by playing sudden death playoff commencing at the first hole and continuing until there is a winner. In case of a handicap competition strokes will be awarded as they were for the first 18 or 36 holes depending upon the length of the match.

In strokeplay competition ties will be decided on the basis of the lowest gross or nett score for the last 9 holes of golf of the course played, regardless of the starting tee box dependent upon if the competition is played on a gross or nett basis. If this still results in a tie then the last 6 holes will be used and if necessary the last 3 holes or last hole used to determine a winner.

4. Practice

Practice is not allowed on the course prior to a stroke play competition on the day of the competition.

5. Caddies & Buggies

Caddies may be used in any competition if so desired. Buggies can be used in Club Match Play, Stableford or medal competitions.

6. Local Rules

The Local Rules are published on the reverse of the score card and from time to time on Club notice boards. If a doubt rises about the interpretation of a local rule then the Committee will give a decision.

7. Distance Measuring Devices

A player may obtain distance information by using a device that is designed to measure or gauge distance only. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his/her play (gradient, wind speed, temperature etc) the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used.

8. Handicaps

Players are required to make themselves aware of their responsibilities under Clause 8 of the CONGU Unified Handicapping System. In particular they are reminded that they are responsible under 8.10 for reporting to the Committee all qualifying scores returned away from their Home Club. They are also reminded that they should make suitable reduction to their playing handicap if playing in another competition before the Committee has made adjustment in respect of any qualifying scores returned (or if they are unable to establish whether the Committee has done so). Away scores may be reported by returning the card to the Secretary's Office or by advising the Club Secretary in writing or email. Players are reminded that the penalty for playing from a handicap higher than that to which he is entitled is disqualification (Rule 6-2).

The Committee will review handicaps annually and advise players of any alterations made.

9. Issuing score cards, recording scores and prizes

Score cards will normally be available from the Professional's shop and it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that the following information is recorded on the card before it is handed to another competitor for marking:

Full Name, Date, Start Time, Handicap

On completion of the round the card should be checked and signed by both the competitor and the marker. In individual events the scores should be entered into the Players Score Input (PSI) terminal situated in the Spike Bar. The completed card should then be deposited in the Competition Box

which is situated in the Spike Bar. For other events the cards should be placed in the competition Box. The Committee will consider the card returned when it is either handed to a Committee member or dropped into the box.

In match play competitions it is the responsibility of the winning player(s) to enter his/their name(s) on the draw sheet by the closing date of that round. In the event that the tie has been played and no name entered both competitors may be disqualified.

In order to comply with the rules of Amateur status most, but not all prizes will be purchased through the Professional's shop or a credit note will be issued to be added to the members bar account. Unless otherwise requested within 14 days of the competition prizes will be credited to the members account in the Professional's shop.

A "twos" competition is an optional extra competition run in conjunction with most competitions (but not scrambles and match play events). All competitors who have entered and recorded a gross two on any hole will be entitled to a share of the balls purchased with the proceeds of the entries. A hole in one entitles the player to a share of the balls counting as two "twos". Disqualified cards will not result in disqualification of any twos recorded.

10. Presentations

For some events a prize giving ceremony will be arranged for the evening of the event and this will be advertised on the notices posted for the event. All prize winners at such events should attend in person to collect their prize. In the event that winners cannot attend then this should be communicated to the Committee as soon as possible in order to avoid any embarrassment.

11. Pace of Play

In the interest of all, players have an obligation to play at a reasonable pace. Slow players at the start of a field can ruin the day for all players

behind them. Consequently the Committee will do all It can to ensure that play is conducted at a reasonable pace.

The Rules of Golf provides that “The player shall play without undue delay and in accordance with any pace of play guidelines laid down by the Committee”. The penalty for breach of this rule is loss of hole in match play and two strokes in stroke play, and for a repeated offence, disqualification.

The Committee have therefore decided on the following maximum pace of play guidelines

3 ball stroke play rounds 4.00 hours (nine holes, 2 hours)

4 ball stroke play rounds 4.20 hours (nine holes, 2 hours 10 minutes)

The Committee will monitor these guidelines, but sincerely hope that it will not be necessary to impose any penalties for slow play.

12. Inclement weather and suspension of play

A competition will not be suspended simply on account of rain, unless the rain is so heavy that it would be unfair to require players to continue. Where rainfall causes the greens to flood, depending upon the severity of the flooding, play must continue until play is formally suspended by the Committee. Play may also be suspended where the weather conditions render it dangerous to continue, such as lightening or fog. Suspension of play will be announced as effectively as possible, but due to the nature of our course this is not easy. Please see Rules of Golf 6-8 for correct procedures.

In potentially dangerous situations play must be discontinued immediately and if a player fails to discontinue play the he is disqualified, unless circumstances warrant waiving the penalty as provided in Rule 33-7.

The following signals will be used:

Discontinue Play Immediately: One prolonged note of siren

Discontinue Play: Three consecutive notes of siren, repeated

Resume Play: Two short notes of siren, repeated

Play Abandoned: A further prolonged note of siren

13. Discontinuation

Players are expected to complete the play of a round other than by reason of illness, injury, inclement weather or emergency. In addition, players entering a 36 hole competition are expected to complete both rounds. Players discontinuing play without good reason risk suspension from future events at the discretion of the Committee.

14. Referees

Referees will be provided and appointed by the Committee for the Finals of all Match Play cups.

15. Dress code

Competitors are obliged to abide by the dress code of the Club in operation at the time.

16. Etiquette

All players are requested to familiarise themselves with the Etiquette of Golf. Persistent refusal to comply with the Etiquette will be considered by the Committee and appropriate action taken.

ASHBURNHAM GOLF CLUB RULES & BYE-LAWS

1. The name of the Club shall be the "THE ASHBURNHAM GOLF CLUB".
2. Every ordinary member of the Club shall become a member of the Ashburnham Golf Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as the Company)
3. The officers of the Club shall consist of the President, Vice President, Treasurer, Captain and Secretary, and five other persons (Councillors) and the Directors of Ashburnham Golf Company Ltd. The Secretary of the Company shall be the Secretary of the Club, the Officers other than the Secretary and the Directors of Ashburnham Golf Company Ltd. shall be elected annually at the Annual General meeting and the nominations duly proposed and seconded by ordinary members of the Club must be submitted to the Secretary seven days before the date of the Annual General Meeting. Any vacancy occurring during any year may be filled by the appointment thereto by the continuing Club Officers (Councillors) of a member of the Club eligible for election as Club Officer (Councillor). The member appointed to fill the vacancy shall retire at the next following Annual General meeting of the Club.
4. The management of the Club shall be vested as to all matters pertaining to the playing of the game of golf including social events, open competitions, fixtures, competitions, handicaps and regulation and formation of Club rules including the election of a Child Protection Officer shall be in the hands of the Council of the Club comprising the Captain, Secretary and Councillors, and the Management of the Club in respect of all other matters shall be vested in the Directors of Ashburnham Golf Company Ltd.
5. The year of the Club shall end on 30th September.

6. The Directors shall have powers to elect Members. Candidates for election must be proposed and seconded by two Ordinary Members, both of whom must have been members for a minimum period of five years, but not propose and second more than three names for membership within each Club year. Notice of intention to nominate must be submitted to the Secretary in writing. The Candidate's name and address, together with the names of the proposer and seconder, shall be posted on the notice board for 14 days. Persons may not be admitted to membership, or be admitted, as candidates for membership, to any of the privileges of membership without an interval of at least two days between their nomination for membership and their admission. Those becoming members without prior nomination or application may not be admitted to the privileges of membership without an interval of at least two days between their becoming members and their admission. The Club has at least 25 members.

7. **ORDINARY MEMBERS**

An ordinary Member is a Male Member or a Female Member paying full or concessionary rates and only Ordinary Members have the right to vote at a General Meeting.

HONORARY MEMBERS

The Club may elect Honorary Members at any General Meeting on the recommendation of the Directors.

8. Captains, Honorary Secretaries and Secretaries of all Clubs affiliated to the Golf Union of Wales together with officials of the Golf Union of Wales, other than the members of the Ashburnham Golf Club, shall during their period of office, be Honorary Members. Honorary Members shall be exempt from the payment of entrance fees and subscriptions, but shall not be eligible to vote at meetings.

9. **COUNTRY MEMBERS**

Members of recognised Golf Clubs residing over forty miles from the Club House may be elected Country Members at the entrance fee and subscription currently in force.

10. JUNIOR MEMBERS

Junior membership is limited to young people under the age of eighteen on the date of their membership renewal. The Directors shall have power to impose restrictions on the use of the Course and the Club House by Junior Members. Juniors with senior handicaps of fifteen or better can play in the Club Competitions. Juniors with senior handicaps of twenty eight or better can play in Club Midweek Stableford Competitions. Juniors shall not be allowed to compete for sweep monies.

11. STUDENT MEMBERS

The Directors may accept as Members at reduced rates, students who are undergoing full time or substantially full-time academic or professional studies or training.

12. FAMILY MEMBERSHIP

Family membership is limited to parents and to their children under the age of eighteen, in the same household.

13. NON-PLAYING MEMBERS

The Directors may elect non-playing Members, but normally will not do so where the candidate is capable of playing golf.

14. SOCIAL MEMBERS

A Social Member will be categorized as any additional non-playing member that wishes to join the club in order to participate in the social activities of the golf club. He/she will need to be proposed and seconded for election by Ordinary Members, as per rule 6. Social Members will pay a yearly subscription fee (due at the usual renewal period) to be determined by the Directors each year. Social Members will have no voting rights, and their number will not exceed 50 at any given time.

15. TEMPORARY MEMBERS AND VISITORS

Non-Playing

- a. Only an Ordinary Member, Honorary Member, Country Member, Non-playing Member or the Secretary of the Club can introduce visitors.
- b. The Member introducing such visitors must enter the required particulars in the Visitors' Book.
- c. A person residing within ten miles of the Club House shall not be introduced as a non-playing visitor more than twelve times a year, except in the case where the visitor is the spouse/partner of a Full, Honorary, Country or Non-Playing Member, in which case the number of visits is not limited.

Playing

- a. Members of visiting teams and competitors at open meetings shall be Temporary Members without fees.
- b. All persons paying the appropriate Green Fee shall automatically become Temporary Members of the Club and may use all facilities subject to Rule 14.3.
- c. Visitors playing with a member may be entitled to the reduced green fee, subject to the rules applicable at the time.

16. FEES

The fees for each class of members can be varied at the discretion of the Directors. Rates of entrance fees and subscriptions currently in force may be obtained from the Secretary. The Directors shall give notice to all members of any alteration in the entrance fees or subscription one month at least before the commencement of the financial year. Such notice may be posted on the Club notice board. A charge will be made for the use of a locker.

17. Reduced subscription may be granted to those members, on application to the Directors, who have attained statutory

pensionable age, with the qualification that the applicant shall have fifteen years continued membership.

18. No member shall be entitled to compete in any Club competition until all monies due payable by him to the Club have been paid.
19. The entrance fee and subscription shall be payable on election, and subsequent annual subscription shall be due and payable on 1st October. Each Ordinary Member shall be required to pay the levy laid down by the Golf Union of Wales in addition to the ordinary subscription. Any member who after notice has not paid the fees by 31st October will have his name removed from the list of members until such time as any outstanding subscription fees are paid in full. This amount calculate from 1st October to the date at which their resignation is received by the Club in writing. Should no such resignation in writing be received, the full subscription for the defaulting year shall be due, in addition to any current subscription fees due upon re-applying for membership.
20. In the event of a person being elected in either of the last two quarters of the year, the Directors may take a reduction in that year's subscription.
21. The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to forbid the introduction of any person as a temporary member or visitor. Any person whose membership has been terminated shall not be eligible to be introduced as a temporary member or visitor.
22. **TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP**
Any member wishing to withdraw from the Club must give written notice of resignation to the secretary on or before 30th September in any year; failing which the member shall be liable for the subscription becoming due on 1st October.

23. If any circumstance connected with the conduct of a member be

brought to the notice of the Directors, a special meeting will be held to discuss such conduct. At this meeting a member may be asked to attend to present his case. The Directors have absolute power to suspend or expel the member. In such case no refund of fees will be considered.

24. The Annual General Meeting of the Club and Company shall be held as soon as convenient after 1st October, but not later than 31st January. The purpose of the meeting will be to receive the Annual Report: to elect officers and Club Directors for the ensuing year: and to transact any other business of which due notice shall be given. Any Ordinary Member wishing to bring forward any business at the Annual General Meeting shall give notice to the Secretary in writing at the least seven days before the meeting.
25. A Special General Meeting may be called by the Directors, or ten or more Ordinary Members, who shall state the object for which they desire such meeting to be called and formulate a resolution which shall be consistent with the rules of the Club.
26. Fourteen days notice of all General Meetings shall be sent by post to each Ordinary Member. At Special Meetings only the Business specified in the circular convening the meeting shall be transacted.
27. At all General Meetings of the Club and Company forty Ordinary Members shall form a quorum, and should not the number be present within half an hour of the time fixed, no business shall be done, but the meeting shall adjourn to the following week at the same time and hour for which the quorum shall be twenty five.
28. No proxies shall be allowed in voting on any subject, and the Chairman shall have a casting vote in case of equality of votes at all General Meetings of the Club.
29. No alteration of, or addition to, these rules shall be made except at

the Annual General Meeting or at a Special Meeting called expressly for that purpose, when such alterations or additions must obtain the sanction of at least three fourths of the members present. The Notice convening such meetings shall state the proposed alterations or additions to be considered, and must be placed on the notice board at least 14 days before such meetings.

30. INTERPRETATION OF RULES

The Directors shall be sole authority for interpreting the rules, bye-laws and regulations of the Club, and for settling all disputes relating to the affairs of the Club or to the conduct of members.

31. GENERAL

The Club shall open on weekdays, Saturdays and Sundays at times to be decided by the Directors. The Bar will be opened at hours to be determined by the Directors in compliance with the Licensing Regulations currently in force. Alcohol is not supplied to members on the premises otherwise than by or on behalf of the Club and the Club is established and conducted in good faith.

32. Every holder of a trophy may retain the trophy in his possession for a maximum period of twenty eight days. At the end of this period the trophy must be returned to the Secretary in good condition. During the period of his possession the holder is responsible for the safety and care of the trophy and for insuring the same to its full value.

33. The Rules of the game shall be those of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, subject to the Local Rules in force for the time being.

34. Regulations regarding young persons using the Club House will be decided by the Directors from time to time.

35. Dogs under no circumstances to be allowed in the Club House or

on the Course.

36. GAMING MACHINES

In no circumstances are children under the age of eighteen years to use the Gaming Machines

37. LEAGUES

Any groups of members regularly organised for the purpose of competition must annually apply in writing to the Directors for permission to play. Such groups must only play under the conditions granted by the Directors. Any financial activities organised by such groups are their sole responsibility. The Club, Company or Officers disclaim any responsibility for such financial activities.

38. LADIES

The Directors may authorise the Ladies Section of the Club to appoint its own Officers, consisting of a President, Captain, Secretary, Treasurer and Committee. To this Committee may be delegated the management of the Ladies' competitions; the decoration and furnishing of the Ladies' part of the Club House and such other matters as the Directors may from time to time decide. The Ladies Committee shall submit their Rules to the Directors for approval.

39. ARTISANS

The Directors are empowered to authorise play on the Course by members of the Ashburnham Artisan Club, under conditions and times laid down and varied, if necessary by the Directors.
